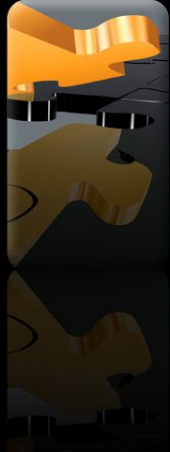

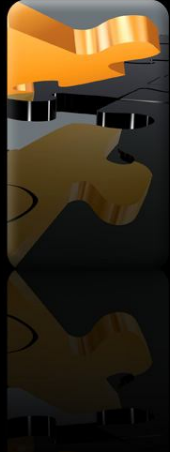

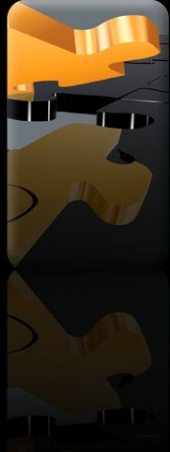

  - Ongoing collaboration with TCOOMMI

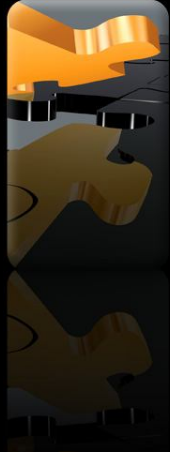


# Essential Functions

One of 8 states selected 3 year grant period

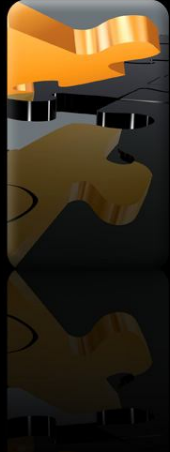
- Three areas of work 1<sup>st</sup> year:

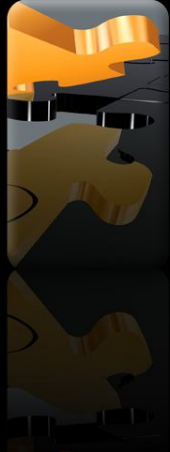
